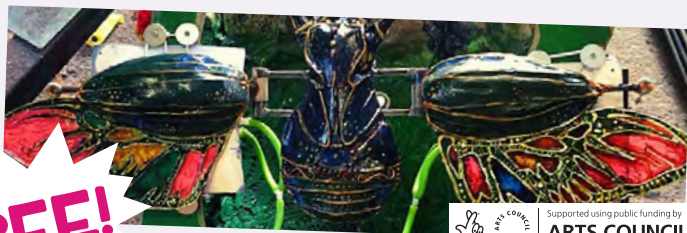
Little Lost Robot Studio

An immersive, walk-through forest installation of oversized, robotic flowers and hanging gardens. As visitors move around it becomes apparent that the forest's appearance subtly changes according to their movements and position in space. These biologically inspired, plant-infused, robotic sculptures react to audience movements and behaviours with creative

digital programming. Simply walking, stepping, swaying, spinning or even dancing in the space will change the movements, shape and mood of the sculpture.

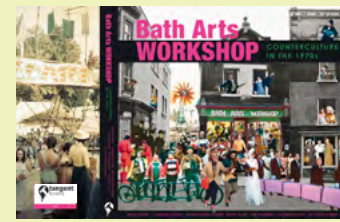
